Time is of the essence. Please think about making a contribution to ensure AACA and its Library & Research Center will be the world's greatest automotive resource facility.










When visitors enter the AACA headquarters they will immediately see an interesting sampling of up to 10 antique vehicles on display. Beyond that, visitors can learn about the history of our hobby and AACA through interactive displays and historical memorabilia. Staff will be on hand to greet visitors and direct them to other areas within the building, including a large gift shop. Headquarters will be housed on the first floor and offices will be laid out in a logical pattern for work flow. Trophy engraving, assembly and processing will be near the loading dock. Membership processing will be in the opposite corner of the building. Guests may use the elevator or grand staircase to access the Library & Research Center on the upper level.



"America's Automotive Library" and its more than 2-million-piece archive will be housed on the second floor featuring a balcony overlooking the lower display area. Several seating areas will be available, depending on each guest's reading or research needs. Automotive reference books will be available for open browsing but the main library collection will be housed in a separate climate-controlled area consuming more than 1/3 of the upper floor and visible through glass walls. The library will also feature a classroom for public and private programs, a media production studio, and a state-of-the-art digitization room for scanning, preserving and sharing library holdings with users across the globe.



The front of the AACA Headquarters and Library & Research Center will be visible from Hershey Park Drive, with some eight million vehicles passing by every year. As visitors enter our 185-space parking lot they will be greeted with up-close views of the glass façade and catch a glimpse of the vehicles on display in the lobby area. Visitors will enter the building via a ramp that leads to the main entry doors. The horizontal metal slats in front of the windows will not only block out afternoon sun, but subtly pay homage to an automobile grille.
